

Graduate Personal Property Appraiser (GPPA) Designation Requirements

To earn the National Auctioneers Association's GPPA designation you must:

- Be a member of the NAA
- Register for and attend all 40 hours of the GPPA designation class and pass the exam
- Within three months (90 days) of completing the class:
 - Become USPAP compliant by taking the <u>15-Hour USPAP</u> class and passing the exam
 - If already USPAP compliant, must remain current through the 7-Hour USPAP Update class completed every two years
 - Available annually with NAA, though accreditation is through The Appraisal Foundation and USPAP courses are offered elsewhere
 - Submit a USPAP-compliant Appraisal Report as described in the GPPA Appraisal Report Evaluation checklist, including:
 - One mechanical asset
 - One non-mechanical asset
 - An asset of your choice

Once earned, to maintain your GPPA designation you must:

- Be a member of the NAA
- Maintain your USPAP compliance
- Pay the annual designation dues fee of \$50 by September 30
- Complete 24 hours of continuing education (CE) every three years
