

Master Personal Property Appraiser (MPPA) Designation Requirements

To earn the National Auctioneers Association's MPPA designation you must:

- Be a current member of the NAA
- Hold the <u>GPPA designation</u> for a minimum of 3 (three) years
- Provide evidence of continuing education in personal property appraisal, equivalent to at least 14 CEs in the last three years
- Be USPAP compliant
- Provide at least three asset-specific appraisals for review by the GPPA/MPPA committee, i.e. three heavy equipment appraisals
- Complete the MPPA application and submit \$125.00 application fee
- MPPA candidates must submit additional coursework in appraisals or proof of previous appraisal experience. Applicants must complete a two-page application that is reviewed by a peer review committee. USPAP training must be completed and supporting materials of upper-level appraisal work must be submitted.

Once earned, to maintain your MPPA designation you must:

- Be a current member of the NAA
- Pay yearly designation fee of \$50 (\$25 if also hold CAI designation)
- Provide proof for USPAP compliance every two years
- Obtain 24 hours of CE every three years--at least 15 hours of those CEs must be in advanced appraisal education
- Audit GPPA once every six years
